I invested one week of time last month (April), teaching at our Children's Ministries Institute in Warrenton Missouri. The entire course entails twelve weeks of instruction. I have the privilege of teaching ten class sessions on "The Principles of Christian Leadership." It is a great joy to pass on some of the things I have learned in 35 years of full-time ministry to those who are just beginning. There were students from all over the U.S.A., along with one from Canada, one from Switzerland, and one from the Philippines.
